

A. Tribal storm shelter program.

As of April 30, there have been 53 shelters completed for tribal members which began in December. No report from Ken Jones for May storm shelter installations. The wet weather has slowed down progress and with this in mind, we ask tribal members who were approved for a shelter to be patient.

Once the shelters have been completed, the homeowner will need to <u>register their shelter with</u> their local fire department.
